WHAT IS Birth Tissue

- Placenta *One placenta donor can help make 30 healing grafts.
- Umbilical cord
- Amniotic fluid

THE NEED FOR Birth Tissue

The healing properties of birth tissue help minimize inflammation and the risk of infection. Patients with birth tissue grafts heal exponentially faster than traditional treatments with little to no scarring.

Additional uses:

- Wound care
- Burns
- Spinal cord injuries
- Ocular

Who can DONATE

- Both c-section and vaginal AND scheduled/ unscheduled deliveries have the opportunity to donate birth tissue.
- Donation is voluntary, there is no cost to the patient or hospital and there are no additional procedures involved.
- Birth tissue is only acquired after the safe delivery of a healthy baby.

A mother's choice to donate birth tissue does not impede the safe delivery of her baby.
